



The purpose of The Hundred Club of Broward County, Inc. is to provide a measure of comfort to the families of those who daily risk their lives in the service of others. The Hundred Club is a 501 (c) 3 organization.

The Club does this by providing direct financial assistance to dependents of Broward County law enforcement officers and fire fighters who have lost their lives or have been permanently disabled in the line of duty.

At the time of a catastrophic injury or death an initial payment of \$20,000 is immediately provided to the family to help relieve the tension, confusion and panic with regard to money matters.

Continued support is provided for the families on an individual basis. Financial assistance from The Hundred Club is unencumbered and is in addition to any insurance or other protection available to the family.

The Broward chapter, chartered February 2, 1962, consists of over 300 members. The Hundred Club provides funds to the affected family solely from monies collected through our dues and donations.

Dependents of any Broward County police and firefighter can apply for our educational scholarships at nine Florida colleges. A current list of these institutions is on the the100club.net website.

The Officers and Board of Directors meet at least twice annually to review activities, plan strategies and ensure financial stability. Board members serving as officers, board members or in other capacities, do so without compensation. Traditionally, in April and November, the entire membership attends a dinner meeting.
